



Canada	--.--.10	<p>\$1 White-tailed Deer / \$1 Atlantic Walrus pair reprint</p> <p>Originally issued on 20.10.05, this definitive pair has now been reprinted by CBN on TRC paper, ostensibly the same as the original printing. They were printed on a new Super Intaglio press.</p> <p>The match is quite good and the differences, apart from one, are subtle.</p> <p>The reprint is on a whiter paper and the printing more glossier, although this can really only be seen from the selvedge. However, the major difference is that the reprint is on thicker paper -- 12/100 mm as opposed to 10/100 mm. Perforations and phosphor (tagging) appear identical.</p> <p style="color: blue;">This item has NOT been supplied to standing order customers. 		<p>A discovery has been made in the 21.5.2009 National Association of Flower Arrangers [NAFAS] commem/defin booklet.</p> <p>The "A" from "MAIL" to the left immediately above the left paperclip cut in the iridescent security overlay has been omitted from all 4 of the gold definitives.</p> <p>The omission appears to be universal on all NAFAS booklets.</p> <p>Now many of these books have been scissored for their commem stamps and the Machins relegated into the postage bin.</p> <p>However, we have retained these Machins and can offer collectors this item at the normal new issue price.</p> <p>It is unlikely that this stamp will be scarce, with 4 copies per booklet.</p> <p>Of course, if you have the booklet, you already have four copies.</p> <p>However, most specialist Machin collectors will need one for their collection.</p>

GB	17.9.10	 <p>Post &amp; Go - Birds of Britain (sa) (6) (ex packs)</p> <p>These stamps are available from Post &amp; Go terminals and can be obtained with 5 different service indicators: 1st, 1st Large up to 100gr, Europe up to 20gr, World Wide up to 10gr, and World Wide up to 20gr. The stamps may be obtained singly, or in strips of 5 of the same value or in strips of 5 of various values. There are 6 different designs.</p> <p>Thus there are a significant number of combinations of machine-dispensed stamps (clearly there are 6 designs x 5 values = 30 different stamps. Then there are strips).</p> <p>The pack contains the lowest value (1st) in all six designs.</p> <p>As with the original FastStamps issue, the literals differ on the machine printed stamps from those in the pack, which are specially printed for philatelic customers.</p> <p>Unfortunately (or fortunately, depending upon your perspective), we are only able to supply packs. Note that the pack is titled "Birds of Britain I". Clearly, more are to follow.</p>

Canada	4.10.10	<p>\$10 Blue Whale sheetlet 2 (illustration next page)</p> <p>\$10 Blue Whale, single ex sheetlet</p> <p>This is Canada's largest stamp (so far) and is equal in size to two \$8 Grizzly Bear stamps. The size is appropriate as the Blue Whale is the largest creature ever to have lived on the planet. It is clearly aimed at the philatelic market as the stamp is too large to be used commercially (except in limited circumstances) and, if used, very few will 'survive the drive', so to speak. Produced in both intaglio [recess] (the whale) and offset litho (the background), the stamp incorporates several security features including micro-printing the whale's Latin name <i>Balaenoptera musculus</i> in the dark blue wavy lines and a pale blue line at the very top.</p>

		<p>When seen under UV there is a little scuba diver above the rear of the whale; and the dark blue micro-print wavy lines and the reddish background (top right) also fluoresce.</p>						
GB		 <p>Postal Union Congress Reproduction Pack £1 PUC, ex pack (1v)</p> <p>During the London 2010 Festival of Stamps Exhibition, Royal Mail issued a commemorative pack containing a reproduction block of 4 of the famous £1 1929 Postal Union Congress stamp considered by most collectors as the most beautiful of all British stamps ever issued. The facsimile reproduction was printed in intaglio by Enschedé on uncoated and ungummed paper with the reverse bearing FACSIMILE printed continuously diagonally in grey by litho. A single crowned GvR facsimile watermark [the same that the original stamp bore] appears at the centre of the block with parts of it extending across all 4 reproductions; also in grey by litho. As this stamp sells in excess of \$1,000 mint and \$2,000 MUH, it is missing from most GB collections. A facsimile provides a great opportunity to fill this gap in your collection. [Australian facsimiles of the 5/- green Sydney Harbour Bridge, are likewise very popular].</p>
