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



ISP is an umbrella organisation incorporating Cartor, Walsall & Courvoisier Security Printers.</i></p> <p style="text-align: center;"><i>The Machins in Pane 1 were printed with 2 phosphor bands together with a central label.</i></p> <p style="text-align: center;"><i>The 1p, 2p, 81p & 97p Machins all have an iridescent overlay and code MPIL / M14L and are all new.</i></p>							

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		<p><i>The 81p stamp is a new colour "Sea Green" and appears to have been printed in error to the intended "Holly Green" [Royal Mail colours]. 		<p>An overprinted M/S has also been issued for EUROPHILEX 2015 International Stamp Exhibition at a premium price and rationed to 3 per person. Only 7500 were produced. It is ONLY available at the exhibition and can not be purchased from Talents House. Why Royal Mail continues to pursue such policies which discriminate against most of its customers is really unbelievable and is a poor commercial decision. Surely they do not expect collectors to fly to the Exhibition just to buy exhibition items? As I have said before, I know of no other "struggling" organisation where certain products are in demand but it refuses to sell them to you -- a completely non-commercial stance.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Postscript</p> <p>Many stories have now emerged from exhibition attendees, principally relating to how they were unable to acquire an overprinted mini sheet despite following "procedures". This has generated a lot of negativity towards Royal Mail which it so richly deserves.</p>

		<p>Panes 1 & 2</p> <p><i>This PSB was issued at a premium of 95p above face.</i></p> <p><i>All panes were printed by International Security Printers [ISP] with 2 phosphor bands by litho.</i></p> <p><i>The Royal Field Observer stamp of Pane 1 was part of the 2007 British Army Uniforms set which was printed by litho by Enschedé.</i></p> <p><i>There is no sheet equivalent for the current issue it being found in the PSB only.</i></p> <p><i>Both stamps are 2B & P14½ and BOTH carry the "2007" micro date (under the soldier's armpit).</i></p> <p><i>The colour matching of the two printings is very good.</i></p> <p><i>However the phosphor bands from the 2007 issue are much more visually stronger under normal white light than those for the current PSB stamp.</i></p> <p><i>The First World War Centenary commemoratives in Panes 2 & 3 are of identical design to the sheet stamps but some exhibit subtle shade differences.</i></p> <p><i>For example, the sheet Rifleman stamp is more an olive brown whilst that in the PSB is more a blackish brown.</i></p> <p>Panes 3 & 4</p>					

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		<p><i>Of greater significance, to our eyes, the sheet stamps have white gum whilst the panes of the PSB have a bluish gum.</i></p> <p><i>The sheet stamps and the PSB were both printed by Cartor.</i></p> <p><i>The 1p, 5p & £1.33 Machins all have an iridescent overlay and code MPIL / M15L and are all new.</i></p> <p><i>The NVI definitive size Poppy stamp has previously appeared as a self adhesive and also in the 2010 Business and Consumer Smilers sheetlet with PVA gum.</i></p> <p><i>However, remember that individual stamps from M/S are not accorded catalogue status by SG whilst those from booklet panes are.</i></p> <p><i>Thus this stamp from the PSB will most likely be given catalogue status.</i></p> <p><i>The sheet stamps and the PSB were both printed by litho by Cartor.</i></p> <p><i>[The FSC C100572 code on the reverse of the PSB identifies Cartor].</i></p>

Panes 2 & 3 contain six commemoratives, the same as the sheet stamps. The sheet stamps and the PSB were both printed by litho by Cartor [ISP]. Pane 4 contains three new Machins -- 10p, 50p & £1.00 all with iridescent overlay & code MPIL / M15L.</i></p> <p><i>The 5p Machin with this code appeared in the First World War Centenary PSB (above).</i></p> <p><i>[The FSC C100572 code on the reverse of the PSB identifies Cartor].</i></p>
